- gain nationally recognised accreditation through the awarding body ASDAN and provide opportunities to achieve qualifications through non-formal learning.

- structure their youth work within an established framework;

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Working Together to Accredit Young People's Learning

UK Youth and ASDAN have come together to share their skills and experiences of developing learning programmes for young people that are relevant to young people's needs. Together, the two organisations have used their extensive expertise to create, develop and support this innovative Award programme.

UK Youth is the largest non-uniformed National Voluntary Youth Organisation in the UK with a network comprising of 40 local member groups in England representing the major county and metropolitan areas and the National Members – Scotland, Northern Ireland and Wales.


UK Youth exists to develop and promote innovative non-formal education programmes for and with young people – working with them to develop their potential. UK Youth's special contribution to the development of youth work is their focus on the personal and social development of young people in the UK whose potential can be better realised through non-formal education routes. They seek to apply the principles of effective youth work to the contemporary interests and needs of young people via programmes that offer accredited learning outcomes.

UK Youth supports the development of the Youth Achievement Awards and the Youth Challenges throughout the UK and beyond. In Scotland, Northern Ireland and Wales, the Awards are operated by the national associations in Scotland, Northern Ireland and Wales (Youth Scotland, Youth Action Northern Ireland and Youth Cymru respectively).

ASDAN is an educational charity that creates opportunities for learners to achieve personal and social development through the achievement of awards and qualifications, thus to enhance their self-esteem, their aspirations and their potential contribution to their community.

ASDAN manages and administers the work associated with supporting nearly 6000 registered centres (mostly schools and colleges) throughout the UK, publishes a catalogue of over 100 titles, supervises the moderation and verification procedures for its awards, and develops new curriculum resources and qualifications in response to the needs of the profession. Many ASDAN programmes are recognised by the Department for Children, Schools National Framework, regulated by the Qualifications and Curriculum Authority. and Families, and in Spring 2000 ASDAN was approved as an Awarding Body for qualifications within the new National Framework, regulated by the Qualifications and Curriculum Authority.

Introduction to the Youth Challenges and the Youth Achievement Awards

The Youth Challenges and the Youth Achievement Awards are an activity-based approach to peer education. The Awards are designed to help develop more effective participative practice by encouraging young people to progressively take more responsibility in selecting, planning and leading activities that are based on their interests. The peer group model encourages the development of a wide range of life skills through a flexible and informal approach.

The Youth Achievement Awards were introduced in 1997 and were initially established in the youth work sector as a means of recognising and accrediting young people's achievements through a peer group approach. More recently, schools, colleges and training providers are finding them an equally valuable tool in motivating and engaging their young people. Building on their success, the Youth Challenges were launched in 2002 meeting the demand for a similar award for the lower age group. In all levels of the Awards young people are encouraged to take on progressive levels of responsibility through involvement in a wide range of self-identified activities. Since September 2008 the Junior Achievement Awards (JAA), aimed at the 7-11 age group, has also been available nationally. The youth volunteering charity **v**, set up to implement the recommendations in the Russell **Commission's** 2004 report, place the Youth Achievement Awards at the very heart of a new "national framework for youth action and engagement". **v** recommend "wider use of the Youth Achievement Awards to recognise young people's personal development through volunteering". As a strategic partner of **v** the YAA is part of the new national framework to support youth volunteering and strengthens "the links between volunteering and accreditation" - especially in relation to skills development – as **v** works on its aim to attract many more young people into volunteering.

THE AWARDS

- Recognise and accredit young people's achievements
- Provide opportunities to achieve qualifications through non-formal learning
- Encourage progressive responsibility and ownership of learning
- Provide a mechanism by which to measure the quality of work with young people
- Reinforce good practice
- Encourage participation and social inclusion
- Use peer education

THEY ENABLE YOUNG PEOPLE TO

- Enhance self awareness and self-esteem
- Develop communication skills and resolve differences by negotiation
- Get on with and work well with others
- Explore and manage feelings
- Understand and identify with others
- Develop values
- Plan ahead

By empowering young people to choose the activities that they will complete in order to achieve their Awards they develop a sense of ownership of their activities and the learning involved. This in itself is highly motivating, but is further enhanced by the sense of achievement gained when young people are able to receive an accredited certificate that recognises their individual contribution to the activities in which they are involved. The Youth Challenge and Youth Achievement Awards can help youth services achieve their targets in relation to recorded and accredited outcomes for young people.

In using the peer group to assess and support the young people through the Awards, young people develop a range of social skills that includes negotiation, problem solving, communication, working with others etc. Some of these skills can be also accredited through Key Skills qualifications (known as the Core Skills in Scotland). In addition, the reviewing and recording procedures have been designed to promote the development of study skills through planning, reviewing, recording and creating a personal portfolio. In addition to the Award booklets, each young person must submit a portfolio of evidence.

The Youth Challenges and Youth Achievement Awards can be accessed by any organisation working with young people in a context that is compatible to the use of the Awards and the ethos of UK Youth. Organisations that are currently registered to use the Awards include county-wide voluntary youth associations, statutory youth services, Connexions partnerships, young offender institutes, national voluntary youth organisations, youth offending teams, local youth projects, training providers and pupil referral units. At present there are over 1000 individual youth groups across the UK using UK Youth's Youth Challenges and Youth Achievement Awards to accredit the quality youth work that their young people are involved with. Each year approximately 16,000 young people take part in the Awards and around 5,000 young people complete their Award.

Feedback from these organisations regarding the impact of the Awards is incredibly positive and emphasises their accessible nature and relevance to young people from a wide range of backgrounds.

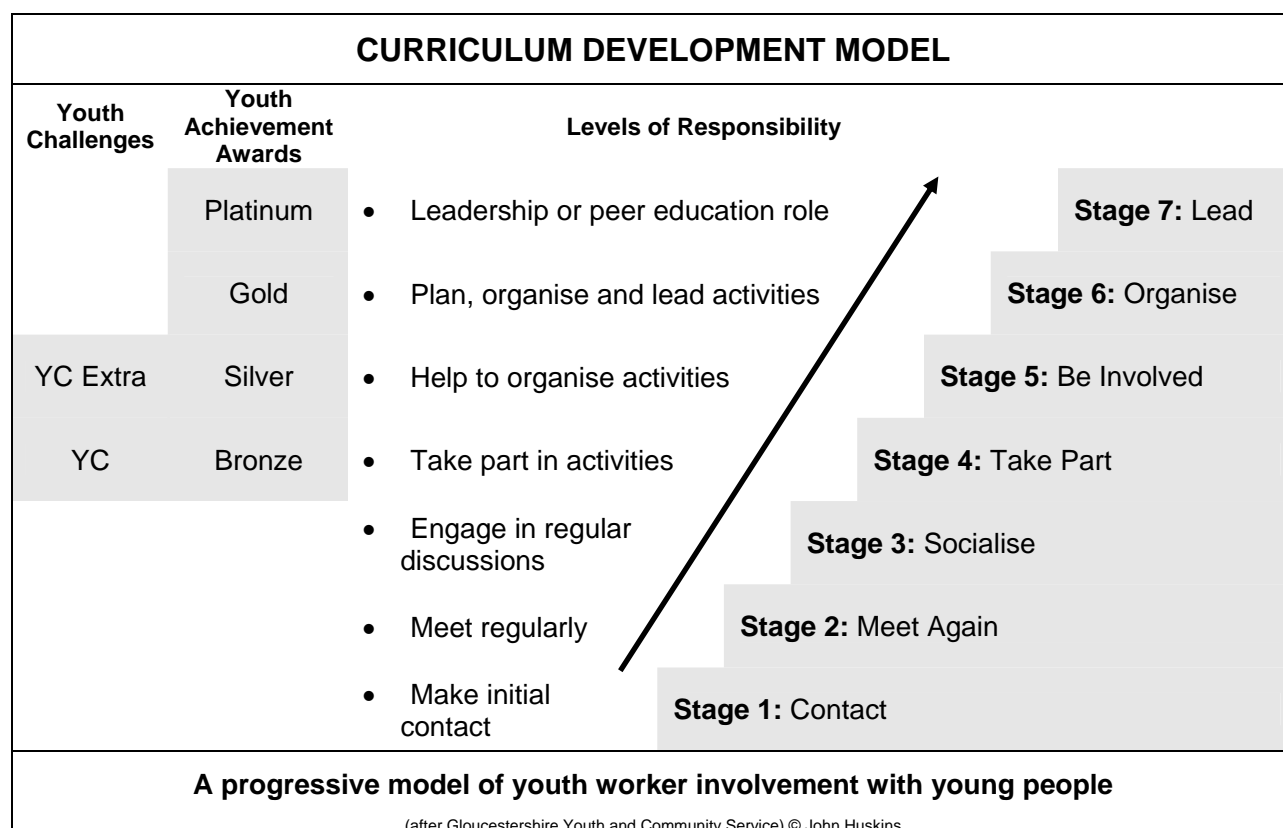
A Curriculum Development Approach

The Youth Challenges and the Youth Achievement Awards are based upon the youth work Curriculum Development Model described by John Huskins in his book '*Quality Work with Young People - developing social skills and diversion from risk*'¹.

The Curriculum Development Model is a way of working whereby the young person (supported and guided by the Award Group Worker), progressively takes on responsibility for their own involvement, their learning and their actions.

There are four stages of involvement that can be recognised through the Youth Challenges and the Youth Achievement Awards. Young people can directly enter the programmes at the level appropriate to their interests and abilities. The Youth Challenges are internally certificated and are aimed at young people aged 11 to 14 (Key Stage 3), although they may be appropriate for people older, or even slightly younger. The Bronze to Gold Youth Achievement Awards are aimed at young people who are 14 plus (Key Stage 4 and beyond), with the Platinum young leaders award being appropriate for young people of 16 plus.

Generally young people aged 11 to 13 become involved in the Youth Challenges and young people aged 14 and over become involved in the Youth Achievement Awards.



The Levels of The Awards

Youth Challenge

This is a 30-hour programme comprising of five six-hour activities with a central element of peer assessment supported by the Award Group Worker. Encouraging young people to take part in activities is the focus at this first level.

Youth Challenge Extra

This 30-hour programme can be used as a progression from the Youth Challenge or as direct entry for a young person capable of demonstrating the ability to help organise. The programme comprises of five six-hour activities.

Bronze Youth Achievement Award

The Bronze Award encourages young people to take part in peer group activities. To complete Bronze young people need to undertake four 15-hour *challenges* supported by the Award Group Worker.

Silver Youth Achievement Award

The Silver Award comprises of six 15-hour challenges and encourages young people help to organise their own activities. By taking an increased level of responsibility and helping to organise the activities they are making a vital contribution to ensuring that the *activity* takes place.

Gold Youth Achievement Award

The Gold Award requires the young person to complete seven 15-hour challenges and make a *presentation*. The focus in Gold is on planning, organising and leading activities. Significant responsibility will be demonstrated at this level.

Platinum Youth Achievement Award

Platinum is the highest level of the Awards and, although similar in structure to the other levels, direction is provided on the activities that must take place. The Award includes a total of approximately 120 hours participation. This Award requires the young person to go through processes that will help them to develop the skills to take on a leadership role - and because of this young people need to be over 16 years of age when they start the award. The young person is required to produce a *personal development plan*, undertake *training*, undertake *placements* working with young people, produce an *evaluation* of their progress, and then prepare for and give a presentation. Whilst this award is more prescriptive in content than any of the other awards, if successfully completed it will have prepared the young person with the skills and background to make an active and positive contribution to youth work.

The Process of Completing the Youth Challenges and the Youth Achievement Awards

1. Agree challenges and targets with the young people. A challenge is defined as being an activity that the young person intends to do, and which is either new to that young person or that builds upon their previous achievements. Targets are what the young person plans to achieve when doing their challenge.
2. Form the Award Group of young people who will help the young people select and agree their challenges, support the young people taking part to complete their challenges, and finally assist in reviewing and recording their achievements and learning and approve completed challenges and recommend young people for the Award. Award Group members are supported and guided by the Award Group Worker, who should ensure that young people are fully aware of the minimum requirements for successful completion of the Awards.
3. The young people will complete the challenges, while collecting evidence and creating a personal portfolio. The young people will complete an Award Booklet to record and review their challenges. The Challenge/ Award booklets are available in a variety of formats including Braille, large print, Pictures/Symbols, audio, on-line, British Sign Language video and a number of languages other than English.
4. Two stages of moderation are completed. Award Group assessment and internal moderation of portfolios by the Agency Moderator or another Award Group Worker is conducted for the Youth Challenge and Youth Achievement Awards. An additional stage is completed for the Youth Achievement Awards where the portfolios undergo external moderation by ASDAN.
5. Once portfolios have been approved, certificates are produced and sent to the Operating Agency key contact, along with a copy of the completed External Moderation Feedback Forms. Certificates are normally distributed within three weeks of the external moderation.

This will also be covered in detail on the Introductory Training day, which is required for all Award Group Workers.

Accrediting Prior Learning

Certain past achievements can also be used to count towards the Youth Achievement Awards. More information on this and the other awards which have credit value within the Youth Achievement Awards can be found in the “Guidelines to the Youth Challenges and Youth Achievement Awards” which can be downloaded from Youth Achievement Awards section titled YAA Resources of the UK Youth website www.ukyouth.org. This will also be covered in more detail on the Introductory Training day, which is required for all Award Group Workers.

Registration to run the Awards

UK Youth are committed to making the Awards accessible to both large and small organisations but need to balance the income generated with the costs incurred by national development of the programme. In order to be able to use the Awards with your young people you will need to ensure that you are registered. The same registration enables you to run the Junior Achievement Awards, Youth Challenges and the Youth Achievement Awards. We have two levels of registration in order to ensure that all groups using the Awards receive both local and regional support.

Operating Agency Status:

There are three different types of registration as an Operating Agency:

- **Independent Regional Operating Agency** - appropriate for schools, colleges, prisons, youth services, countywide voluntary associations and regional support agencies. Participating Units register directly with an Operating Agency and access support and information from their OA.
- **National Operating Agency** - appropriate for organisations who wish to deliver the Junior Achievement Awards, Youth Challenges and Youth Achievement Awards through Regional Operating Agencies and/or Participating Units across England. A national OA may support regional Operating Agencies in their network who, in turn, support local Participating Units. Alternatively, a national OA may work directly through Participating Units, or by registering a combination of both.
- **Regional Operating Agency (attached to a National Operating Agency)** - appropriate for organisations who wish to deliver the Junior Achievement Awards, Youth Challenges and Youth Achievement Awards as a Regional Operating Agencies and receive support from a national OA.

NB: If you are interested in running the Youth Achievement Awards across more than one country in the UK please contact the Education and Training Manager (contact details at the back) to discuss how this can work for you.

Participating Unit Status:

All Participating Units will need to be registered with an Operating Agency. All Operating Agencies are required to authorise the registration of Participating Units through the YAA members' only website. It is important that each group delivering the Youth Achievement Awards is registered separately as portfolios are sampled and moderated on a unit by unit basis.

There are three different types of registration as a **Participating Unit**:

- **Participating Unit** - an individual youth group or small youth project that will generally work with less than 35 young people on the Youth Achievement Awards per year (JAA and YC numbers are not limited). If a Participating Unit presents a considerable number of portfolios for external moderation in a year (i.e. 35 or more), we reserve the right to insist that they register as an Operating Agency in their own right or sub-divide into more than one unit.

- **Secondary Schools Participating Unit** – this enables a school to deliver the Awards throughout the school with as many young people as they wish to accredit in a year. Please note that UK Youth is able to offer secondary schools a specific support package, and links to an established national Operating Agency. Please contact the Education and Training Manager (details at the back) for more information on this.
- **Junior Achievement Award Participating Unit** - an individual youth group or small youth project or primary school...after school club which wishes to deliver the JAA only. As the JAA is internally moderated we do not limit the number of young people who can work on their Junior Achievement Award in any year.

Registration fees are charged on an annual basis and a pro-forma invoice for these will be issued each March. Registrations that are made in the middle of a year are charged the pro-rata amount to the end of the following March. The current list of fees can be found on page 19. Operating Agencies may need to charge an additional support or affiliation fee in order to deliver services to their Participating Units - providing the organisation is operating in a not-for-profit fashion, UK Youth appreciates that this may be necessary.

Unless we are advised otherwise, Operating Agencies will be issued with a pro-forma invoice for the registration fees of all Participating Units registered through them. If you wish for any Participating Unit registration fees to be invoiced directly to the Participating Units please contact the Education and Training Administrative Officer (contact details at the back of this document) who will ensure that this happens.

To register for the Youth Achievement Awards in Scotland, Wales or Northern Ireland you will need to contact the relevant country office. Please note that there may be slight regional variations in the registration structure and registration fees. Contact details of these organisations can be found on page 27.

What you will receive when you register

In addition to enabling you to access the Junior Achievement Awards, Youth Challenges and Youth Achievement Awards programmes you will receive the following additional benefits when you register to run the Awards:

The benefits of registering as a National Operating Agency

There are many benefits to becoming a YAA National Operating Agency. Quite apart from the ability to set up as many Participating Units across England as you need, NOAs also have the opportunity to be part of pilot projects and to help shape the development of the Awards. NOAs automatically become a member of the NOA peer support network – a group who meet twice yearly to share good practice, discuss issues, and generally provide a mutually supportive environment for national key contacts. In addition to the above, from April 2009, UK Youth is offering National Operating Agencies an additional package of benefits. These are listed in the table below:

Registration with ASDAN

Registration with UK Youth to run the Youth Challenges and Youth Achievement Awards will also enable you to access ASDAN's qualifications. We hope that this will encourage progression from the Youth Achievement Awards to more formal qualifications as

appropriate. To register with ASDAN directly normally costs £190 per academic year. Training and support for both of these programmes can be bought in directly from ASDAN.

Operating Agency Responsibilities

1. As an Operating Agency it is your responsibility to maintain and oversee the quality and standards in the operation of the Awards within your organisation and all registered Participating Units.
2. It is the Operating Agency's responsibility to ensure that all workers involved in the Awards within the Agency, and Participating Units that are registered through you, have attended the Introductory Training (for which an attendance certificate will be issued). This is to ensure the appropriate support for young people who are working towards their Awards.
3. We will require you to nominate an appropriate number of workers who will undergo additional training and assume responsibility for moderating and developing the Awards within your Agency.
4. Your nominated Agency Moderator(s) will be expected to attend regular External Moderation meetings (EMMs), bringing completed portfolios, networking and sharing experiences with other moderators.
5. Operating Agencies are required to cascade all appropriate information sent to them from UK Youth (e.g. contents of YAA update mailings) to their registered Participating Units.
6. Operating Agencies are required to adhere to the Programme Delivery Agreement which outlines the responsibilities in more detail. If you have any concerns about your Agency's ability to meet any of the responsibilities outlined in this document, please contact the Education and Training Manager who will be able to discuss this with you further.

Participating Unit Responsibilities

1. As a Participating Unit regular liaison with the Operating Agency's Key Contact is essential to maintain and oversee the quality and standards in the operation of the YAA within your unit.
2. Each Participating Unit must ensure that all workers using the YAA have attended the Introduction to Youth Challenges and/or Youth Achievement Awards training, in order to provide the appropriate support to young people who are working towards their Award.
3. Participating Units are required to operate the Awards in a non-discriminatory manner that reflects UK Youth's commitment to Equal Opportunities.
4. We will expect you to become an advocate of good practice in relation to the delivery of the Youth Challenges and/or the Youth Achievement Awards.

Training and Support

Any agency or unit registering to run the Awards for the first time will need to ensure that the staff involved in the direct support and/or internal moderation of the Awards has been trained by UK Youth, or a UK Youth registered trainer.

Training can be arranged through UK Youth on either an in-house basis, for a maximum of 12 workers, or individual places can be bought on multi-agency training days, which are run on a regular basis across the country.

The training certificates that UK Youth issue are valid for two years from the date of training. This is to ensure that the Awards are operated by workers who have up-to-date knowledge and experience. These certificates can be renewed for a further two years if workers are able to evidence that they have been actively involved in the delivery and/or moderation of the Awards, and have kept abreast of developments in the Awards and accreditation in the past two years (by attending conferences, moderation events, network meetings etc).

Additional Support Needs

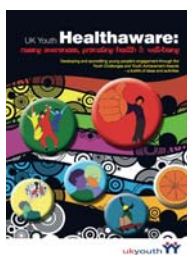

Materials

Every young person who takes part in the Awards programme will need to have a booklet for recording his or her achievements. These booklets are available to order from UK Youth and include the costs of external moderation (where relevant) and a certificate on successful completion of the Award. A current price list for booklets and other supporting material can be found at the end of this document. The booklets are available in a range of other accessible formats for young people with specific needs and in languages other than English.

Toolkits:

There are a number of toolkits available to support practitioners working within formal, non-formal and informal settings to assist them to develop awareness around specific themes and issues. Each of the toolkits provide you with an overall context of how the issue relates to your work, sample YC and YAA challenges and targets, session plans, evidence sheets, links to other awards and qualifications and signposting to other resources.



Health and Wellbeing Toolkit

A toolkit of sample challenges, targets, evidence sheets, activity sheets etc to guide you through delivering Health Awareness with your young people. Included with each toolkit is a CD Rom to enable workers to print out session plans and evidence sheets easily.



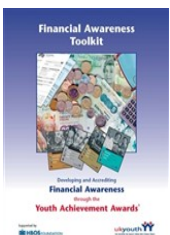
Youth Active Challenges Toolkit

This resource has been produced to encourage young people to take up sport and physical activity. The resource contains the ideas and starting points for workers on the following sports and activities: simple games and activities, cycling, swimming, basketball, football, athletics, cricket, racket sports, dance, action sports, circuit training and fitness building. Included with each toolkit is a CD Rom to enable workers to print out session plans and evidence sheets easily.



The Drinkaware Challenges Toolkit

This toolkit was designed to enable workers to accredit alcohol education work with your young people. Includes a DVD showcasing alcohol education projects and a CD Rom to enable workers to print out session plans and evidence sheets easily.



Financial Awareness Toolkit

A toolkit to guide you through delivering financial awareness challenges with your young people. There are five themes; Paying for Goods and Services, A Home of Your Own, Buy Goods and Services Online, Borrowing Money, and Consumer Rights. Included with each toolkit is a CD Rom to enable workers to print out session plans and evidence sheets easily.

UK Youth are able to provide workers with training designed to enable them to make the most effective use of the above resources. This training is delivered as an in-house day (maximum 12 delegates) and can be adapted for workers who have already been trained in the Youth Achievement Awards (as a half day session) or for workers who need a full introduction to the Awards as well as any of the toolkits (full day session). 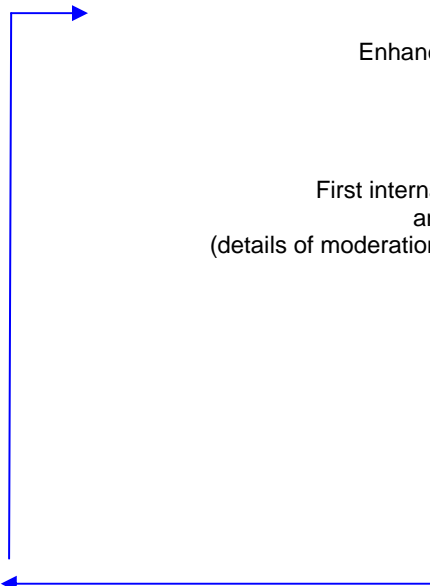
