



Recruit and engage young people on the programmes from the target group

Develop an individualised delivery plan aligned with the core requirements of the programme

Collect data and assist the **UK Youth** Impact and Research Team in the evaluation of the programme – from young people surveys to youth worker interviews

Attend regional or programmatic meetings and trainings to share best practice and project updates

Support **UK Youth** to gather impactful stories and case studies from the work

Support **UK Youth** to facilitate funder visits, corporate volunteering and impact visits to projects

Regularly check in with **UK Youth** around project delivery, communication opportunities and delivery visits.

Key things in contracts

Minimum hours of youth worker time with young people on the programme

Minimum number of young people to engage & group size

Target group – i.e. young women and girls with personal barriers, new to social action, NEET

Core curriculum / programme content or topics to be covered

Delivery window –
When can you start?
When do you need to have completed?

When do we need participant records or surveys by?

When you're promoting the programme who do you need to mention?

When you'll get paid (we'll always send you a purchase order for you to invoice us)

We work to give as much freedom and time as we can!

Due diligence and quality assurance

Pre-contracting due diligence checks during delivery partner selection process:

Charity commission and/or Companies House record

Web presence and digital footprint

Quality assurance visits during delivery:

Monitoring appropriate youth work, safeguarding and health and safety practices being followed




- 1 You get an email like this –

- 2 Sign in using ‘Organizational account’ – you don’t need a Microsoft account




- 3 If you see this pop up click on “Request Access”




- 4 UK Youth approves your access
