What is safeguarding?

Safeguarding is the action taken to promote the welfare of children and young people (Under 18 years old) and protect them from harm.

Safeguarding means:

- protecting young people from abuse and maltreatment
- **preventing** harm to health or development
- ensuring young people have the provision of safe and effective care
- taking action to enable all young people to have the best outcomes.




"Safeguarding" refers to measures designed to protect the health, wellbeing and human rights of individuals.

Contextual Safeguarding

As young people grow and develop, they are influenced by a whole range of **environments** and people outside of their family

Young people may encounter <u>risk</u> (sometimes multiple) in any of these environments.


Contextual safeguarding looks at how we can best understand these risks, engage with children and young people and help to keep them safe.

It requires a **community wide** approach.

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As youth workers we need to know....

WHO? - Are the young people? (Numbers, Demographics) **WHO** are the engaging with?

WHERE? – Are they going? **WHERE** are connecting with others?

WHAT? – Are there needs? **WHAT** support can we offer them?

HOW? Do we access them? **HOW** do we engage and build meaningful relationships?

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What are some of the risk and trends you have identified in your work?

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
