Introduction

Building Connections is a three-year programme designed to bridge the gap between young people, youth workers, and employers - creating meaningful, sustained, and inclusive pathways to employment.

Delivered in partnership with Coca-Cola Europacific Partners (CCEP), the programme helps youth organisations embed employability support into long-term community infrastructure through a strategic three-year arc:



building local relationships and pilot events



expanding employer networks and refining delivery



creating sustainable models and peer learning between cohort

Spotlight on: Wigan Youth Zone

Louis' path to employment





"What I was doing before Building Connections programme was job searching but never getting no where with it and really struggling to find a pathway to employment I was trying to find employment by going to businesses in the local area and also applying everywhere online.

Showcase: Young Leicestershire (YL)

- They connected with new groups of young people and explored local partnerships, including with Severn Trent, to deliver accessible employability workshops, covering inclusive recruitment practices.

Key learnings & legacy

Deep Dive peer-learning sessions improved delivery across organisations.

Building Connections' "test and learn" culture was key to adapting support to local needs. Delivery capacity, staff investment, and better gender targeting are priorities for scale-up.
