



## Young Person Eligibility Criteria

To apply for this programme, you must have experience of working with young people who would meet the following eligibility criteria. Young people who do not meet the criteria will not be eligible to participate, even where it is felt the programme might benefit them.

<b>ESSENTIAL - Young people must meet ALL of these criteria:</b>	<b>AND - one or more of the following criteria:</b>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Minimum age 16 (on or before 22<sup>nd</sup> May 2026)</li> <li>✓ Maximum age 20 (on or before 22<sup>nd</sup> May 2026)</li> <li>✓ Has the right to work in the UK and can provide documentation</li> <li>✓ Able to take part in 25 hours of employment each week (with reasonable adjustments)</li> <li>✓ Not currently employed for more than 15 hours per week</li> <li>✓ Available to participate in at least 5 of the 6 weeks of the programme (between 20 July and 31 August 2026 - exact dates tbc)</li> <li>✓ Must be able to attend the preparation week activities between 13- 24 July '26 (exact dates tbc)</li> <li>✓ Living in one of the areas that the programme is delivered in and not planning to move out of the area during the duration of the programme</li> <li>✓ Not living in the 'secure estate' during the placement period. <i>'Secure Estate' includes Young Offender Institutions (YOIs), Secure Training Centres (STCs), and Secure Children's Homes (SCHs).</i></li> <li>✓ Proficiency in spoken English</li> <li>✓ Not currently involved in/expected to be involved in any legal or professional appointments (for example court hearings/trial, solicitor meetings, or a high volume of appointments with a youth offending team worker, social worker or GP) that means you are unable to commit to 25 hours per week work during the placement period.</li> <li>✓ Not studying towards a degree</li> <li>✓ Has not previously taken part in the Summer Jobs Programme (either as part of the intervention or control groups).</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Are, or have been, in contact with Youth Offending Teams</li> <li>• Have been arrested and released with no further action</li> <li>• Have previously been in the secure estate (prisons, approved premises, bail accommodation and youth detention accommodation)</li> <li>• Are attending, or have attended, an alternative provision unit</li> <li>• Have had at least two fixed- term exclusions</li> <li>• Have been permanently excluded</li> <li>• Are, or have been, in care</li> <li>• Have been the victim of violence</li> <li>• Have, or have had, a social worker</li> <li>• Have a sibling or parent who have been involved in serious violence</li> <li>• Are, or have been, persistently absent from school (less than 90% attendance)*</li> <li>• Have been identified as at risk of criminal exploitation**</li> </ul> <p>*Only to be used by external referral agencies<sup>1</sup></p> <p>**Only to be used by external referral agencies and must provide a narrative summary (in under 50 words) of why the young person is identified as at risk, which will be reviewed by UK Youth</p>

<sup>1</sup> **External Referral Agencies** are any organisations that have a direct relationship with the young person and are not a Summer Jobs 2026 Delivery Partner with UK Youth. For example; social care, health, youth justice, schools, police, etc.
